Lab-grown meat is produced by cultivating animal cells in bioreactors to replicate the taste and texture of traditional meats. Proponents see it at the future of food and argue it offers benefits for human health, animal welfare, and the environment by reducing bacterial risks, mass slaughter, and pollution. However, challenges like high energy use, cost, and imperfect texture remain.

In the U.S., the industry is still in its early stages. However, several conservative states, including Florida, Alabama, and Arizona, are pushing back with legislation to ban or heavily regulate it. Florida has proposed criminalizing the sale and distribution of lab-grown meat, with fines and jail time. Opponents, including livestock lobbyists and some politicians, argue that lab-grown meat isn't "real" meat, often framing the issue as a cultural and political one, with some conservatives viewing it as a threat to traditional values and masculinity.
